Through the lens of Lagos-based photographer Favour Orji's project Chimes of Change, it examines the emotional stages—Denial, Anger, Bargaining, Depression, and Acceptance—as responses to Nigeria's current challenges. The project documents how young Nigerians navigate a time of significant transformation, marked by high inflation, a weakening currency, and food insecurity, offering insight into their resilience and capacity for adaptation.

Favour Orji, a Lagos-based photographer born in the late '90s, uses his work to explore these experiences through Chimes of Change, a project capturing the profound changes in Nigerian society. Orji, with over eight years of experience documenting life in Nigeria, views photography as a tool to "bear witness to life's truths," and through his work, he seeks to reflect the resilience and complexity of the human condition amidst the nation's turbulence.

Chimes of Change symbolizes Nigeria's evolving reality, where high inflation, a falling currency, and widespread food insecurity pose challenges that push individuals through various emotional stages. By adapting the Kübler-Ross model, this study seeks to analyze how Nigerian youth confront these changes, transitioning through Denial, Anger, Bargaining, Depression, and Acceptance. It will also explore how photography can offer a medium for understanding and documenting these experiences.

2. THE STUDY EXAMINES

1. DENIAL

The shock and disbelief felt by many Nigerians as foreign exchange rates plummeted, weakening the naira's value to around 1,700 per US dollar. This stage captures the refusal to accept the depth of economic decline.

remarkable innovation and creativity, it is sadly directed toward negative and harmful purposes.
